

## Plan for the implementation of NAPPO standards

### 1. Name of Standard

NRMF No. 23: *Guidelines for Consignments in Transit*

### 2. Country Reporting

Mexico

### 3. Relevant Authority

#### 3.1 Current Authority

##### A: Legislative Authority

Yes. *Federal Plant Health Law* (Ley Federal de Sanidad Vegetal) and *Federal Law on Measurements and Standards* (Ley Federal sobre Metrología y Normalización).

##### B: Regulatory Authority:

Yes. The following Official Mexican Standards specify the phytosanitary requirements that prohibit the transit of consignments on Mexican territory:

- Official Mexican Standard NOM-005-FITO-1995, by which the foreign quarantine is established to prevent the introduction of the Khapra beetle, (Published in the Official Gazette of the Federation, on 04/07/96).
- Modification of the Official Mexican Standard NOM-005-FITO-1995, by which the foreign quarantine is established to prevent the introduction of the Khapra beetle, (Published in the Official Gazette of the Federation, on 15/04/02).
- Official Mexican Standard NOM-010-FITO-1995, by which the foreign quarantine is established to prevent the introduction of Banana pests (Published in the Official Gazette of the Federation, on 18/11/96).
- Official Mexican Standard NOM-011-FITO-1995, by which the foreign quarantine is established to prevent the introduction of Citrus pests (Published in the Official Gazette of the Federation, on 24/09/96).
- Official Mexican Standard NOM-012-FITO-1996 by which the foreign quarantine is established to prevent the introduction of Potato pests (Published in the Official Gazette of the Federation, on 13/02/96).
- Official Mexican Standard NOM-013-FITO-1995, by which the foreign quarantine is established to prevent the introduction of rice pests (Published in the Official Gazette of the Federation, on 02/12/96).

- Official Mexican Standard NOM-014-FITO-1995, by which the foreign quarantine is established to prevent the introduction of cotton pests (Published in the Official Gazette of the Federation, on 20/12/96).
- Official Mexican Standard NOM-015-FITO-1995, by which the foreign quarantine is established to prevent the introduction of coconut pests (Published in the Official Gazette of the Federation, on 22/14/97).
- Official Mexican Standard NOM-016-FITO-1995, by which the foreign quarantine is established to prevent the introduction of sugarcane pests (Published in the Official Gazette of the Federation, on 12/02/96).
- Official Mexican Standard NOM-017-FITO-1995, by which the foreign quarantine is established to prevent the introduction of wheat pests (Published in the Official Gazette of the Federation, on 05/12/96).
- Official Mexican Standard NOM-018-FITO-1995, by which the foreign quarantine is established to prevent the introduction of corn pests (Published in the Official Gazette of the Federation, on 10/12/96).
- Official Mexican Standard NOM-019-FITO-1995, by which the foreign quarantine is established to prevent the introduction of coffee pests (Published in the Official Gazette of the Federation, on 10/12/96).
- Modification to the official Mexican Standard NOM-019-FITO-1996, by which the foreign quarantine is established to prevent the introduction of coffee pests (Published in the Official Gazette of the Federation, on 17/04/02).

### 3.2. Revisions to authority

Yes. In this case it is necessary to revise the Official Mexican Standards aforementioned and adjust them to the specifications established in the RSPM No. 23: *Guidelines for Consignments in Transit*.

## 4. **Obtaining Authority to Adopt the Standard**

Yes. The modifications to the Official Mexican Standards that restrict the transit of consignments on the Mexican territory are to be published in the Official Gazette of the Federation around December of 2007.

## 5. **Implementation of standard**

The transit of consignments through the Mexican territory has been managed, analyzing case by case, as requests have been made.
