Regional Standards for Phytosanitary Measures 35

Review Process







Current RSPM 35 (2009)

- Describes guidelines for the importation and movement of stone and pome fruit trees and grapevines among NAPPO member countries.
- Outlines a combination of phytosanitary measures for mitigating the risk of regulated pest introductions associated with the international movement of this propagative material, without undue restriction of trade.
- Contains Annexes with Pests Lists of organisms such as bacteria, fungi, nematodes, phytoplasmas, viroids, viruses, and virus-like agents or pest vectors that may promote the spread, entry and establishment of stone and pome fruit and grapevine pest diseases.






Why are we reviewing this RSPM?

- Created in 2009.
- High priority for review by NAPPO (U.S., Canada and Mexico).
- Well defined/updated guidelines.
- Facilitates the safe introduction of plant material into and between NAPPO countries.
- Complements Clean Plant Certification programs in place or planned.
- Impacts industry resources/agricultural commodity sectors that are key for the North American agricultural industry.





Why are we reviewing this RSPM?

There are new:

- Pests and changes in taxonomy (e.g., viruses, phytoplasmas).
- Diagnostics (e.g., improved molecular tests, new diagnostic and identification methods and protocols).
- Phytosanitary status of pests (e.g., U.S. actively working to eradicate *Plum pox virus* from the U.S.).
- Regulations (e.g., Not Authorized Pending Pest Risk Analysis, Q37 Revisions) and standards:
 - ➢ ISPM 36-Integrated measures for plants for planting (2012)
 - an updated version of RSPM 24-Integrated Pest Risk Management Measures for the Importation of Plants for Planting into NAPPO Member Countries (2013).
 - Other referenced standards have also been revised since 2009.





General Objectives of RSPM 35 for the NAPPO Region

- Prevent the spread, entry, and establishment of quarantine pests.
- Manage regulated non-quarantine pests.
- Facilitate equitable and orderly trade.
- Promote the use of:
 - integrated systems approaches
 - good plant protection practices





Objectives of the Subject Matter Expert Group for the Revision of RSPM 35

- Review and update the RSPM 35 guidelines and associated pest lists based on:
 - the most recent adopted international and regional standards
 - current industry practices
 - current regulations
 - Iatest scientific and technical information





Current Progress

- Selected a Chair and a Co-chair.
- Set work priorities.
- Divided the work by Subject Matter Expert subgroups (science and pest lists).
- Conducted updated meetings by subgroups.
- Established the need to add missing information (new tables missing in previous document, priorities, or other specifics).
- Incorporated comments received from industry, academia and government.



Highlights

- **Update** the pest lists for each commodity, with sub-working groups created to work on each pest group.
- Standardize columns in tables.
- Add new information missing in the original document.
- **Review** and comment on current guidelines by each member country.



Deliverables



- Updated version of RSPM 35 provides:
 - Current guidelines for the importation and movement of stone and pome fruit trees as well as grapevines by NAPPO member.
 - An updated list of fruit tree and grapevine pests and their status within NAPPO countries.
- Timeline: 1-2 years
- Country Consultation:
 - 90 days public comment period.
 - Stakeholders communicate with U.S. project SMEs.
 - Parallel harmonization/update efforts to be monitored.





Conclusions and Next Steps

- Revise and share
 - Pest Lists
 - The 2009 RSPM 35 policy document

with other scientists from academia, industry and government in Canada, Mexico and the USA.





Impact of RSPM Standards

- Influences bilateral work plans.
- Determines appropriate measures for handling certain commodities or materials.
- Sets conditions for production systems.
- Assists in the accreditation of private entities.
- Provides a foundational framework to guide bilateral negotiations.
- Establishes reasonable parameters that are technically justifiable, based on scientific evidence.
