	contractor secure sys there had to accept the contractor of the co	<ul> <li>Background: In July 2023, the chairperson worked with the NAPPO Secretariat's contractor to upgrade the PAS platform's software and code to have a stable and secure system. The chairperson consulted with EG members to determine if there had been any issues with access and functionality with the PAS.</li> <li>Canada and Mexico members reported not having any problems accessing and viewing the systems.</li> <li>The US member indicated not being able to log into the system.</li> </ul>			
Item 2:	<ul> <li>Linking OPRs to the IPPC's International Phytosanitary Portal (IPP).</li> <li>Background: Around 2009, NAPPO expert group members came to a consensus to harmonize NPPO procedures for postings to the IPP. When a country decides to post an official report on the IPP, their respective editor to the IPP posts the title, pest scientific name, pest status, and the following short summary: "For full report, please visit the NAPPO Phytosanitary Alert System (www.pestalert.org)."</li> <li>Discussion topics and summary: <ol> <li>Verify if countries continue doing this step.</li> <li>Canada and U.S. members confirmed to continue posting and linking to the IPP.</li> <li>Mexico's member mentioned that while aware of the process, she has not been able to post due to time constraints.</li> </ol> </li> <li>Confirm editors to post OPRs on the IPP for each country. <ol> <li>Canada: Steve Côté</li> <li>Mexico: Ana Lilia Montealegre</li> <li>US: Ignacio Baez is the main editor for OPRs</li> </ol> </li> </ul>
