	Welcoming remarks were made, and apologies were of those not able to attend the meeting

Consensus:	 Google Docs is up and running. However, not everyone has access yet. Action 1: Alonso will ensure that all are invited to review and share the document. Eric provided the background to ISPM 15 for the S&T document Meghan added the outline and provided descriptions of categories A subgroup of Leigh, Scott, and Brad discussed the definitions of WPM categories; some of this discussion is captured in the Google Docs draft. Action 1: Leigh to share updated definitions from the US Action 2: Canada (Arvind) and Mexico (María Eugenia) to provide any definitions used by their NPPOs by November The group will review all three sets of definitions to develop

Item 5:	Updates on data gathering – All
Consensus:	 In the absence of robust and complete WPM data, the group discussed the estimation of risk based on interception and absence of data. Eric suggested the group work on a scientific explanation of the risk based on science, much like what Leigh has drafted in the supporting files on Google Docs. This option is better than using incomplete interception data, which appears to be what is currently available in North America. Arvind discussed the difference between standardized and nonstandardized WPM, manufactured vs. non-manufactured, for e.g., pallets that are one size. Eric noted that WPM with bark has an increased risk compared to, for example, peeler cores. With these types of descriptions and explanations, we can build a case for risk based on the biology of the pest and note the lower risk associated with highly processed wood based on PRAs. Faith noted that we should not restrict ourselves to interception data and can use information for risk assessments. In addition, we should investigate assumptions that certain types of WPM are safe, e.g., barrel staves, wine barrels, etc. Leigh noted that the volume of trade for any WPM should be acknowledged in the document, as well as for recommendations to NPPOs. The group agreed to review the scope of the project to ensure we can finish in a timely manner Leigh noted that we might consider a title change for the document, from "Evaluating the risk associated with different types of wood packaging material – Opportunities to improve ISPM 15 compliance" to "Evaluating the risk associated with different types of wood packaging material – Opportunities to reduce the movement of wood infesting pests." The group noted that the title should be reviewed near the end of the project, and thought that this is a good suggestion. Action 3: Other sources of data. Alonso will ask other RPPOs for data, such as COSAVE, EPPO, etc.
