Background CAHFSA

phytosanitary (SPS) regime and to execute SPS
actions and activities that can be more effectively and
efficiently executed through a regional mechanism.

Within this framework, the Agency was to **replace** the defunct **Caribbean Plant Protection Commission**

Recognized as the <u>10th Regional Plant</u> <u>Protection Organization</u> during CPM-13

Highlights

Two Plant Health Guidelines have been completed and three Animal Health protocols are in the developmental stage.

A draft specification for cassava flour has been developed and is in the final stage of the regional adoption process

Coordinated regional risk assessment for the trade in animal products and now six Member States have received approval from COTED to export pork and poultry products to regional markets

5. Major Challenge

The Caribbean Region comprises small developing and least developed countries with populations as small as 5000 persons.

Lack of Economies of Scale In most cases the agricultural sector is very small (approx. 0.1% GDP) and **dimension of the** sector cannot justify or support the level of investment necessary for a effective phytosanitary system.

Very limited resources are channeled into other areas.



Opportunities



- Caribbean is also a very intimate community. Many islands are close together, some with free movement of people.
- This provides an opportunity to regionalize some phytosanitary services.
- Opportunity to engage each other on a regional level to offset constraints faced domestically.
