Submitting new project proposals to NAPPO

When?

- o open call for new proposals every 2 years next one will be in 2019
- anytime there is an issue that you consider is important to the NAPPO region

Project prioritization criteria

- o justification or resource expenditures
- o alignment with regional strategic priorities
- o harmonization value for North America
- o focus on pests of concern to member countries
- o availability of technical/scientific expertise
- o "completeness" including resources

- 13 projects work conducted/developed by Expert Groups and managed by the AMC and the Secretariat, plus other activities
- 9 (~70%) of these have industry EG members

Why Industry is "key" to NAPPO

working together with NPPOs

- to implement ISPMs
- develop and implement RSPMs
- develop other products
- share responsibility as "keepers/protectors" of plant resources

Why Industry is "vital" to NAPPO

- Industry as advocates for plant protection in the region including conveying the importance of support for NAPPO services.
- Industry input on proposed projects, review of draft standards and documents, and participation in NAPPO events ensures we are developing relevant, technically and operationally sound products that advance North American harmonization and trade goals.

NAPPO Annual Meeting

- 3 day event mid-October
- 120-150 participants 1/3 to 1/2 from industry
- simultaneous interpretation in 2 (or 3) languages
- rotates location
- EC member of host country = EC Chair for that year
- days 1 & 2 updates/discussions; time for sidemeetings
- day 3 science-based Symposium chosen by host
- includes presentations from industry stakeholders

NAPPO Annual Meeting

- day 1 specific times/locations set aside for ...
 - government meetings by country
 - industry meetings by country
 - combined government and industry meetings
- day 2
 - <u>issues/concerns</u> shared/discussed in the plenary
 - knowledge topics
